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## A unique moment for dua:

Sayyiduna Ubadah bin Samit [RA] reports that Rasulullah [SAW] said:

“Whoever’s sleep is broken at night and recites (the Dua below) and thereafter asks Allah to forgive him or supplicates (for any need), Allah will forgive him and accept his supplication. If he thereafter makes Wudhu and performs Salaah, Allah will accept his Salaah.”

**Laa ilaaha illal-lawhu wahdahu laa shareeka lahu, lahul Mulku wa lahul Hamdu wa Huwa a’laa kulli shay’in Qadeer, Alhamdulillah, Wa Subhanallah, Wa Laa Ilaaha Illallaahu Wallahu Akbar, Wa laa hawla Wa laa quwwata illaa billah.**

Translation:

There is no God but Allah, the One, He has no partner and to Him alone belongs all kingdom and praise and He is able over everything. All Praise is due to Allah, Glory be to Allah and there is no God but Allah and Allah is the greatest, and there is no might and power except by Allah. [Bukhari]

## A short but beautiful dua:

**Allahuma innee as’alukal Afiyah.**

Translation:

Oh Allah, I ask you for Afiyah. [Afiyah is an all encompassing word referring to overall well-being. This can include health, wealth, and safety from anything that may be deemed as harmful.]

## When dua is readily accepted:

1. The last third of the night. [Bukhari, Hadith Qudsi]
2. Between the Adhan and the Iqaamah. [Ahmad, Abu Dawood]
3. While prostrating. [Muslim, Abu Dawood]
4. After each obligatory salaah. [Tirmidhi]
5. During the rain. [ Abu Dawood, Ibn Majah]
6. While travelling. [Bayhaqi, Tirmidhi]
7. On the day of Arafah. [Tirmidhi, Malik]
8. In the month of Ramadan. [Bukhari, Muslim]
9. While breaking the fast at iftaar. [Ahmad, Tirmidhi]
10. While visiting the sick. [Muslim]

## Situations where your dua has been accepted:

1. The person who has been wronged or oppressed.
2. When in severe difficulty after a calamity has struck.
3. The person who is traveling.
4. Someone who is fasting.
5. While reciting or just completed reciting the Quran.
6. Someone who is performing Hajj, Umrah or jihad.
7. Making dua for someone in their absence.
